INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

This Interlocal Agreement ("Agreement") by and between the Grayson County, Texas (the "County"), with the agreement, consent and participation of the Grayson County Commissioners Court, and the Sherman-Denison Metropolitan Planning Organization ("SDMPO"), a political subdivision of the State of Texas, is entered into as of the Effective Date, as defined on the signature page of this Agreement. The County and SDMPO may also each, individually, be referred to herein as a "Party" and, collectively, as the "Parties."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the SDMPO, in cooperation with the local, state and federal agencies, is responsible for carrying out the metropolitan transportation planning process in accordance with Title 23 U.S. Code Section 134 and Title 49 U.S. Code Section 5303 and other applicable federal and state regulations; and

WHEREAS, Texas Government Code Chapter 791 authorizes local governments of the state to enter into contracts for governmental functions and services to increase their efficiency and effectiveness; and

WHEREAS, Title 23 U.S. Code Section 104(f) authorizes Metropolitan Planning (PL) Funds and 49 U.S. Code Section 5301 et seq. authorizes funds to be made available to Metropolitan Planning Organizations designated by the Governor to support the urban transportation planning process; and

WHEREAS, the County and SDMPO are local governments as defined in Texas Government Code Section 791.003(4) and are authorized to enter into this Agreement by the action of their respective governing bodies as prescribed by law;

NOW, THEREFORE, the County and SDMPO, for and in consideration of the mutual obligations, terms, and conditions stated in this Agreement, agree as follows:

ARTICLE I PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this Interlocal Agreement is to define the roles and responsibilities between the County and the SDMPO in regards to the creation of a thoroughfare plan covering the entire Metropolitan Planning Area, which is defined in the SDMPO Bylaws as covering the area delineated by the Grayson County boundaries – north, south, east, and west.

ARTICLE II RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

2.1 The SDMPO, with the assistance of a consulting engineering firm, shall be responsible for the completion of a thoroughfare plan for the Metropolitan Planning Area (in

coordination with County staff and the staffs of member local governments). This includes the collection of all pertinent data, collation of data, bi-monthly reports to the Grayson County Commissioners Court, the SDMPO's TAC, and the SDMPO's Transportation Policy Board. In addition, the SDMPO shall be responsible for scheduling any public meetings the schedule of which shall be determined by the SDMPO.

- 2.2 The consulting engineering firm shall be engaged by the SDMPO utilizing a Qualification-Based Selection process approved by TxDOT. The SDMPO's TAC (the membership of which includes representatives from Grayson County, City of Sherman, City of Denison, and a small cities representative) shall comprise the selection committee for the consulting engineering firm.
- 2.3 County shall be responsible for assisting in providing any available pertinent data to SDMPO staff (including but not limited to existing thoroughfare plans, Comprehensive Master Plans, and Zoning Maps if available), providing oversight and direction that may come from the Grayson County Commissioners Court and editorial review of the document as it is developed.
- 2.4 County and the SDMPO agree to work together to ensure that the creation of this thoroughfare plan is carried out in a cooperative, continuing, and comprehensive manner.
- 2.5 County agrees to provide staff to attend any public meeting or hearing that the SDMPO may schedule to answer questions regarding the thoroughfare plan by citizens.

ARTICLE III PAYMENT TERMS

3.1 Upon execution of this Agreement, County shall render to the SDMPO the sum of Eighty Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$80,000.00) toward the completion of the thoroughfare plan.

ARTICLE IV AUTHORITY; APPROVAL

- 4.1 The respective signatories of the Parties are their properly authorized officials or representatives and have the necessary authority to execute this Agreement.
- 4.2 This Agreement is expressly subject to and contingent upon formal approval by the Grayson County Commissioners Court and by the Sherman-Denison Metropolitan Planning Organization's Transportation Policy Board.

ARTICLE V LIABILITY; IMMUNITY

- 5.1 The County and SDMPO agree that each is responsible for its own negligent acts, omissions, or other tortious conduct in the course of the performance of this Agreement and that no indemnification by or for either Party is provided for or intended hereunder.
- 5.2 Notwithstanding the terms of Section 5.1, neither of the Parties waives, nor shall be deemed hereby to have waived, any immunity or any legal or equitable defense otherwise available against claims arising from the exercise of governmental powers and functions.

ARTICLE VI CONFIDENTIALITY

6.1 The information shared pursuant to this Agreement may be confidential by law or not subject to disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act. The Parties will take reasonable measures to maintain the confidentiality of the exchanged information and not reveal or disclose the information to any person, company, or other entity without the express written consent of the non-disclosing Party. Notwithstanding the above, it is expressly understood and agreed that the County and its officers and employees may request advice, decisions, and opinions of the Attorney General of the State of Texas in regard to the application of the Public Information Act and will follow the advice, decision, and opinion of the Attorney General regarding the release of information requested pursuant to the Public Information Act.

ARTICLE VII NOTICE

7.1 Any notice required in this Agreement must be in writing and delivered to the address below the recipient Party's name below. Delivery must be by hand, by U.S. mail sent First Class, return receipt requested, or reputable overnight courier. Notice will be deemed delivered upon actual receipt by the recipient Party or, in the case of U.S. mail, three days after the postmark date. Notices must be sent to:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the creation and operations of health care provider participation programs in certain counties

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 4, Health and Safety Code is amended by adding Chapter [INSERT] to read as follows:

CHAPTER [INSERT]. HEALTH CARE PROVIDER PARTICIPATION

PROGRAM IN CERTAIN COUNTIES

SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. [INSERT]. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

- (1) "Institutional health care provider" means a nonpublic hospital that provides inpatient hospital services.
- (2) "Paying hospital" means an institutional health care provider required to make a mandatory payment under this chapter.
- (3) "Program" means the county health care provider participation program authorized by this chapter.
- Sec. [INSERT]. APPLICABILITY. This chapter only applies to a county located on the Texas-Oklahoma border that:
 - (1) is not served by a hospital district or a public

hospital;

- (2) borders or contains a portion of the Red River;
- (3) has a population of more than 100,000 and contains two municipalities of 15,000 or more.
- Sec. [INSERT]. COUNTY HEALTH CARE PROVIDER PARTICIPATION PROGRAM. (a) A county health care provider participation program authorizes a county to collect a mandatory payment from each institutional health care provider located in the county to be deposited in a local provider participation fund established by the county. Money in the fund may be used by the county to fund certain intergovernmental transfers and indigent care programs as provided by this chapter.
- (b) The commissioners court of a county may adopt an order authorizing a county to participate in the program, subject to the limitations provided by this chapter.

SUBCHAPTER B. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMISSIONERS COURT

Sec. [INSERT]. LIMITATION ON AUTHORITY TO REQUIRE MANDATORY PAYMENT. The commissioners court of a county may require a mandatory payment authorized under this chapter by an institutional health care provider in the county only in the manner provided by this chapter.

Sec. [INSERT]. MAJORITY VOTE REQUIRED. The commissioners

court of a county may not authorize the county to collect a mandatory payment authorized under this chapter without an affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the commissioners court.

Sec. [INSERT]. RULES AND PROCEDURES. After the commissioners court has voted to require a mandatory payment authorized under this chapter, the commissioners court may adopt rules relating to the administration of the mandatory payment.

Sec. [INSERT]. INSTITUTIONAL HEALTH CARE PROVIDER REPORTING; INSPECTION OF RECORDS. (a) The commissioners court of a county that collects a mandatory payment authorized under this chapter shall require each institutional health care provider to submit to the county a copy of any financial and utilization data required by and reported to the Department of State Health Services under Sections 311.032 and 311.033 and any rules adopted by the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission to implement those sections.

(b) The commissioners court of a county that collects a mandatory payment authorized under this chapter may inspect the records of an institutional health care provider to the extent necessary to ensure compliance with the requirements of Subsection (a).

SUBCHAPTER C. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

Sec. [INSERT]. HEARING. (a) Each year, the commissioners court of a county that collects a mandatory payment authorized under this chapter shall hold a public hearing on the amounts of any mandatory payments that the commissioners court intends to require during the year and how the revenue derived from those payments is to be spent.

(b) A representative of a paying hospital is entitled to appear at the public hearing and be heard regarding any matter related to the mandatory payments authorized under this chapter.

Sec. [INSERT]. DEPOSITORY. (a) The commissioners court of each county that collects a mandatory payment authorized under this chapter by resolution shall designate one or more banks located in the county as the depository for mandatory payments received by the county.

- (b) All income received by a county under this chapter, including the revenue from mandatory payments remaining after discounts and fees for assessing and collecting the payments are deducted, shall be deposited with the county depository in the county's local provider participation fund and may be withdrawn only as provided by this chapter.
 - (c) All funds under this chapter shall be secured in the

manner provided for securing county funds.

Sec. 292.103. LOCAL PROVIDER PARTICIPATION FUND;

AUTHORIZED USES OF MONEY. (a) Each county that collects a

mandatory payment authorized under this chapter shall create a

local provider participation fund.

- (b) The local provider participation fund of a county consists of:
- (1) all revenue received by the county attributable
 to mandatory payments authorized under this chapter, including
 any penalties and interest attributable to delinquent payments;
- Commission as a refund of an intergovernmental transfer from the county to the state for the purpose of providing the nonfederal share of Medicaid supplemental payment program payments, provided that the intergovernmental transfer does not receive a federal matching payment; and
 - (3) the earnings of the fund.
- (c) Money deposited to the local provider participation fund may be used only to:
- (1) fund intergovernmental transfers from the county
 to the state to provide the nonfederal share of a Medicaid
 supplemental payment program authorized under the state Medicaid

plan or through managed care contracts, the Texas Healthcare

Transformation and Quality Improvement Program waiver issued

under Section 1115 of the federal Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.

Section 1315), or a successor waiver program authorizing similar

Medicaid supplemental payment programs;

- (2) subsidize indigent programs;
- (3) pay the administrative expenses of the county solely for activities under this chapter;
- (4) refund a portion of a mandatory payment collected in error from a paying hospital; and
- (5) refund to paying hospitals the proportionate share of money received by the county from the Health and Human Services Commission that is not used to fund the nonfederal share of Medicaid supplemental payment program payments.
- (d) Money in the local provider participation fund may not be commingled with other county funds.
- (e) An intergovernmental transfer of funds described by Subsection (c)(1) and any funds received by the county as a result of an intergovernmental transfer described by that subsection may not be used by the county or any other entity to expand Medicaid eligibility under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (Pub. L. No. 111-148) as amended by the

Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010 (Pub. L. No. 111-152).

SUBCHAPTER D. MANDATORY PAYMENTS

Sec. [INSERT]. MANDATORY PAYMENTS BASED ON PAYING HOSPITAL NET PATIENT REVENUE. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (e), the commissioners court of a county that collects a mandatory payment authorized under this chapter may require an annual mandatory payment to be assessed on the net patient revenue of each institutional health care provider located in the county. The commissioners court may provide for the mandatory payment to be assessed quarterly. In the first year in which the mandatory payment is required, the mandatory payment is assessed on the net patient revenue of an institutional health care provider as determined by the data reported to the Department of State Health Services under Sections 311.032 and 311.033 in the fiscal year ending in 2014 or, if the institutional health care provider did not report any data under those sections in that fiscal year, as determined by the institutional health care provider's Medicare cost report submitted for the 2014 fiscal year or for the closest subsequent fiscal year for which the provider submitted the Medicare cost report. The county shall

update the amount of the mandatory payment on an annual basis.

- (b) The amount of a mandatory payment authorized under this chapter must be uniformly proportionate with the amount of net patient revenue generated by each paying hospital in the county. A mandatory payment authorized under this chapter may not hold harmless any institutional health care provider, as required under 42 U.S.C. Section 1396b(w).
- (c) The commissioners court of a county that collects a mandatory payment authorized under this chapter shall set the amount of the mandatory payment. The amount of the mandatory payment required of each paying hospital may not exceed six percent of the paying hospital's net patient revenue.
- (d) Subject to the maximum amount prescribed by Subsection (c), the commissioners court of a county that collects a mandatory payment authorized under this chapter shall set the mandatory payments in amounts that in the aggregate will generate sufficient revenue to cover the administrative expenses of the county for activities under this chapter, to fund the nonfederal share of a Medicaid supplemental payment program, and to pay for indigent programs, except that the amount of revenue from mandatory payments used for administrative expenses of the county for activities under this chapter in a year may not

exceed the lesser of four percent of the total revenue generated from the mandatory payment or \$20,000.

(e) A paying hospital may not add a mandatory payment required under this section as a surcharge to a patient.

Sec. [INSERT]. ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION OF MANDATORY

PAYMENTS. The county may collect or contract for the assessment

and collection of mandatory payments.

Sec. [INSERT]. INTEREST, PENALTIES, AND DISCOUNTS.

Interest, penalties, and discounts on mandatory payments

required under this chapter are governed by the law applicable
to county ad valorem taxes.

Sec. [INSERT]. PURPOSE; CORRECTION OF INVALID PROVISION OR PROCEDURE. (a) The purpose of this chapter is to generate revenue by collecting from institutional health care providers a mandatory payment to be used to provide the nonfederal share of a Medicaid supplemental payment program.

(b) To the extent any provision or procedure under this chapter causes a mandatory payment authorized under this chapter to be ineligible for federal matching funds, the county may provide by rule for an alternative provision or procedure that conforms to the requirements of the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

Dear Grayson County Officials,

During the 83rd and 84th legislative sessions, the Texas Legislature overwhelmingly passed legislation that granted 11 counties and the city of Beaumont the flexibility and local choice to create Local Provider Participation Funds. Recognizing that the LPPF would help bring more federal funds to their communities, the leaders of each community chose to approve the LPPFs.

Before these actions, the communities did not have adequate means to access their share of the federal funds allocated for the care of the Medicaid and Uninsured population. The LPPF allowed the private hospitals in these communities to receive millions of additional dollars in Medicaid payments; dollars that otherwise would have gone elsewhere. This astonishing outcome was accomplished without expanding Medicaid, without asking the State of Texas for \$1 of General Revenue, and without any form of tax on local residents.

Your local hospitals request your support of legislation to authorize a Local Provider Participation Fund (LPPF) in Grayson County. Like the legislation passed in the 83rd and 84th legislative sessions, the Grayson County Commissioners Court would retain the discretion to decide whether to approve an LPPF for your community, and the LPPF would not require an increase in taxes for your residents. Most importantly, you will have the opportunity to reclaim federal funds to pay for quality healthcare in your community; funds that are now being paid to other counties.

HIGH LEVEL OVERVIEW OF THE GRAYSON COUNTY LPPF

- Communities that do not have a hospital district are unable to fully access federal funds for the care of Medicaid and the uninsured population due to a lack of a source of local government funding.
- The LPPF restores balance by enabling counties that do not have hospital districts to gain access to their fair share of federal funds. And it does so without requiring a county to create a hospital district, or to increase taxes for their residents.



- 8. Equitable Rights of Enforcement. This Easement may be enforced by restraining orders and injunctions (temporary or permanent) prohibiting interference and commanding compliance. Restraining orders and injunctions will be obtainable on proof of the existence of interference or threatened interference, without the necessity of proof of inadequacy of legal remedies or irreparable harm, and will be obtainable only by the parties to or those benefited by this agreement; provided, however, that the act of obtaining an injunction or restraining order will not be deemed to be an election of remedies or a waiver of any other rights or remedies available at law or in equity.
- 9. Attorney's Fees. If either party retains an attorney to enforce this agreement, the party prevailing in litigation is entitled to recover reasonable attorney's fees and court and other costs.

- 10. Binding Effect. This agreement binds and inures to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors, and assigns.
- 11. Waiver of Default. It is not a waiver of or consent to default if the nondefaulting party fails to declare immediately a default or delays in taking any action. Pursuit of any remedies set forth in this agreement does not preclude pursuit of other remedies in this agreement or provided by law.
- 12. Further Assurances. Each signatory party agrees to execute and deliver any additional documents and instruments and to perform any additional acts necessary or appropriate to perform the terms, provisions, and conditions of this agreement and all transactions contemplated by this agreement.
- 13. Entire Agreement. This agreement and any exhibits are the entire agreement of the parties concerning the Easement Property, and the grant of the Easement by Grantor to Grantee. There are no representations, agreements, warranties, or promises, and neither party is relying on any statements or representations of any agent of the other party, that are not in this agreement and any exhibits.
- 14. Legal Construction. If any provision in this agreement is for any reason unenforceable, to the extent the unenforceability does not destroy the basis of the bargain among the parties, the unenforceability will not affect any other provision hereof, and this agreement will be construed as if the unenforceable provision had never been a part of the agreement. Whenever context requires, the singular will include the plural and neuter include the masculine or feminine gender, and vice versa. Article and section headings in this agreement are for reference only and are not intended to restrict or define the text of any section. This agreement will not be construed more or less favorably between the parties by reason of authorship or origin of language.
- 15. Notices. Any notice required or permitted under this agreement must be in writing. Any notice required by this agreement will be deemed to be delivered (whether actually received or not) when deposited with the United States Postal Service, postage prepaid, certified mail, return receipt requested, and addressed to the intended recipient at the address shown in this agreement. Notice may also be given by regular mail, personal delivery, courier delivery, facsimile transmission, or other commercially reasonable means and will be effective when actually received. Any address for notice may be changed by written notice delivered as provided herein.



RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION OF THE GRAYSON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT, TEXAS OPPOSITION TO SENATE BILL 2 AND REVENUE CAPS

- **WHEREAS**, the Texas Legislature has previously considered and rejected proposals for additional revenue caps on counties; and
- WHEREAS, 60 percent of the average taxpayer's property tax burden is due to school taxes while only 14 percent is due to county taxes; and
- WHEREAS, revenue caps would diminish local control and tie the hands of county officials and limit their ability to provide essential services to address the needs and emergencies of their citizens; and
- WHEREAS, county government is already struggling to meet the demands of under-funded and unfunded state mandates such as indigent health care and indigent defense and federal mandates such as the Help America Vote Act and the Clean Air Act; and
- WHEREAS, the demands on county budgets continue to increase including health care, motor fuel, road materials, and all other products and services purchased by counties; and
- WHEREAS, artificial revenue caps will result in a shift of taxes from fluctuating properties, such as oil and gas, to those remaining relatively stable in value, such as residential properties; and
- WHEREAS, revenue caps will not necessarily result in a reduction of property taxes but will result in a severe impact on county services; and
- WHEREAS, Senate Bill 2 also contains many provisions that will undermine a property tax system based upon fair market value and will result in a distorted, inequitable appraisal scheme under which higher value properties will avoid their fair share of the tax burden; and
- **WHEREAS**, it would be inequitable for the Texas Legislature to impose additional revenue caps on local governments without funding, repealing and prohibiting state unfunded mandates;
- **NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Commissioners Court of Grayson County, Texas does hereby express its opposition to Senate Bill 2 and its efforts to limit local control and does hereby oppose any attempts to impose additional revenue caps upon Texas counties, and the Commissioners Court of Grayson County, Texas expresses its deep appreciation to all legislators who oppose this unsound measure.
